

HORSE REQUIREMENTS

All horses must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) dated within 30 days prior to show. Horses from the same farm can all be listed on the same Health Certificate. All horses must be vaccinated from equine influenza and EHV within six months of the show, and have a negative Coggins within 12 months of the show.

Scott Alder

Scott Alder is a USEF "R" judge, course designer, trainer and clinician based in Metamora, MI. He began riding at his family's farm, showing their homebred hunters and jumpers as well as riding sale horses and fox hunting. After graduating from the junior divisions, Scott turned his sights

to the professional ranks and ventured into breeding and training young horses in addition to teaching and developing riders. For over 35 years he managed several recognized local shows and hosted the yearly Michigan Hunter Jumper Association Finals. Scott has been a sought-after officiant coast-to-coast, working as both a judge and course designer at several top shows, including the Desert Circuit, Traverse City Horse Shows, Sonoma Horse Park, Old Salem, Thunderbird Show Park, Palgrave Equestrian Park, World Equestrian Center, Mass Finals, Nor Cal Finals and NEAC Finals. He has numerous hunter derby wins and two top 3 finishes in the \$250,000 HITS Hunter Prix Final. His most memorable moment as a rider was winning the High Performance Hunter Stake Class at Harrisburg on his longtime horse Charismo who he started as a 4-year old. David has judged many shows across the US and Canada, including WEC, WEF, Thunderbird, Vermont Summer Festival, Brownland, Woodside, and Fieldstone, to name a few. Welcome back David!



HISTORY OF THE NEEC

Our Foundation

In the 1970s, 2015 NEEC Lifetime Achievement Award winner Mason Phelps moved from California to Rhode Island. At the time, California had an equitation final for just about everybody and when Mason moved to New England he found that there were no equitation finals – he set about changing that.

In order to start the New Horseman's Junior Medal class, Mason had to become a board member of RIHA. He was then able to join the New England Horseman's Council board and get the Finals started. With the help of Liz Rooney and Gerry Reeves they started the process to convincing the New England Horseman's Council that an equitation medal was needed.

In doing so they created the New England Equitation Committee which organizes and runs the New England Horseman's Council Hunt Seat Medal Finals (hereafter "the Finals"). The original Committee consisted of Mason Phelps, Jamie Mann, Joe Dotoli, Julie Ulrich and Nancy Ciesluk. Over time the Committee added Jay Sargent, John Strohmeier, Dana Jungherr, Fred Hunt, Bob Crawford, and Carl Catani; and more recently Pam Hunt, Lauren Stevens, Debbie Hoyt Banfield, Cookie DeSimone, Amy Eidson, Kristen Bumpus, Armand Chenelle, Kathy Fletcher, Patti Harnois, Olana Laffey, Linda Langmeier and Laurel Tinney; and most recently joining Monica Hunt, Kate McDaniel, Johanna Hyyppa and Kellie Riordan. The Committee has always consisted of professional horsemen.



Changes of Venue

1976

Providence Civic Center "RI Horse Show" Providence, RI

With just 17 Junior riders, the Finals was a class held during the regular show, mixed in with other classes. The specifications back then were that fences were not to exceed 3'6", there was a flat phase and the top four were tested.

How We've Grown

Through the years the judging panel has evolved from just one judge to six judges, working in pairs. The scoreboard with instant running results began in 1993 when the show moved to its latest venue at the Big E in West Springfield, Massachusetts. That same year, the Adult division grew to the point of needing age groups – younger and older adult riders. In 2002, the growing adult division was divided yet again into younger, middle and older. In 2017, it increased again to include four adult divisions.

The Finals have expanded to include many awards and innovative events. Awards such as the Lifetime Achievement Award named in honor of A. Martin Simenson, D.V.M.; the Joanne C. Corsiglia Scholarship Award dedicated to the memory of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Reeve, given to both a junior and an adult proven worthy of the award; and the "Nicholas" award, which is a Career Achievement Award for horses.

Creative thinker, Joe Dotoli, added the Horsemanship Class in 1997. It has three sections: a written exam, a practicum and the rider's first round score from the Finals class. It is named after the rider who won the first year, Katie Battison, who passed away at an early age. This class is now copied across the country and is highly competitive. Some winners have even gone on to be veterinarians!

In 1998, Joe came up with another great class idea: The Challenge of the States. This class, held on Saturday, is open to the junior and adult riders with the top scores from the Open equitation classes who then represent their state. Trainers are not allowed to help riders – they do their own course walk, schooling and planning. Riders dress up in great costumes and work as a team. If given the choice, many riders say they would choose riding in the Challenge of the States over riding in the Finals. It is a true highlight to the weekend.

What is likely the most anticipated event of the show is the Junior Celebration held on Friday night. This dinner is open to all junior riders, their families and trainers. It features a professional musical video presentation that captures the year-long competitions leading up to the Finals and includes photos and video clips from the lives of the juniors who are in their last year of showing.

The New England Championships have grown from just 17 riders in 1976 to a record 253 junior riders in 2010 and a record 208 adult riders in 2009. Its competitors have gone on to become veterinarians, professional riders and trainers, Ivy League scholars, Olympic Gold Medalists and more. What was once a single class lumped in at another hose show is now its own renowned Final held over five days at its own venue and is broadcast worldwide on ClipMyHorse.tv.



NUMERICAL SCORING SYSTEM

Each judge will grade every round by giving a numerical score. This score reflects the judge's opinion of the round and its relative merits compared with the previous rounds. Whether a fault should be considered a minor or major fault can depend on the context of the situation during which it occurred as well as the number of times it occurred. The table on the opposite page is meant to be a guideline, not necessarily "written in stone." Portions are included directly from the USEF Rulebook.

Some Scores Have Become Standardized:

40 – First refusal

50 – An added stride in a combination

50 – Lost stirrup or rein

55 - Trotting on course when not part of a test

Some Scores Are More of a Range:

90's – Classic position and excellent style; Correct execution of the course

80's – Good position and style with some minor faults in the execution of the course

70's – Fair position, some lack of style or multiple minor faults

60's – Poor position or style or major faults on course

Knockdowns:

In a hunter class, where the horse is primarily being judged, the standard score for a knockdown is 45.

In an equitation class however, since it is the rider who is primarily being judged, the round is first judged on its merits and then given a four-point deduction for the knockdown.

For Example:

Rider A has a good position and style, has some minor faults on course and the horse rubs a jump and the rail falls. The judges feel the round deserves an 83, they then deduct 4 points for the knockdown and the final score is 79.

Rider B has a fair position, multiple minor faults on course, misses a distance and has a knockdown. The judges give this rider a 68, they then deduct 4 points for the knockdown and the final score is 64.

About the Scoring System

The panel will consist of six judges grouped in pairs. Each pair will enter a numerical score into a computer terminal at their station. When the last pair has hit "ENTER," the scores will appear on the scoreboard. The scoreboard instantly displays (from left to right) the judges names, the score for that round, and where that score stands on that judge's card. The cumulative average is listed at the bottom of the board.

Rounds one and two are of equal value, and both scores will be added together for the "cumulative score." If there is further testing, based on the overall standings, each pair of judges will score their card as if judging a medal test. Riders may be moved up or down on the card based on their cumulative score, as well as their performance on the test. When the testing is complete, each pair of judges will submit their results to the scorer.

Values will be entered into the computer based on the following point system:

1st place:10 points5th place:1 point2nd place:6 points6th place:0.75 point3rd place:4 points7th place:0.50 point4th place:2 points8th place:0.25 point

Placing for those riders tested will be determined by total points. Ties for other than first place will be broken by cumulative average going into the test. First place ties will require an additional work off and each judge will have one vote for the winner. Total points will be revealed during the ribbon ceremony.

For NEHC Junior Finals only, if the difference between first and second place is two points or less the judges must test. If the difference is more than two points, testing is at the judges' discretion.

RULES & GENERAL INFORMATION

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org/safe-sport.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All exhibitors are required to wear properly fitted protective headgear while riding on the competition grounds. Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, anyone riding in Hunter Jumper and Hunter Seat Equitation sections must wear properly fitting protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM/SEI standards with harness secured while riding any where on the competition grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent, guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor, to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition USEF the Show Committee and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

HORSE REQUIREMENTS: All horses must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) dated within 30 days prior to show. Horses from the same farm can all be listed on the same Health Certificate. All horses must be vaccinated from equine influenza and EHV within six months of the show, and have a negative Coggins within 12 months of the show.

RULES & REGULATIONS: GR839, welfare of the horse will be strictly enforced. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. In the event that NEEC is canceled or shut down prior to the start of the competition due to the occurrence of any circumstance beyond the control of the NEEC – such as an act of God, war, terrorism, government regulations, natural disaster, strikes, civil disorder, or curtailment of large gatherings by applicable governmental order or guidance or by the USEF/ USHJA – to the extent that such circumstance makes it illegal or impossible for the NEEC to run a USEF-sanctioned competition, entry fees paid shall be refunded less the \$100 processing fee.

STABLING: Horses are allowed on the grounds Monday, October 14, 2024 at 12:00 pm and must leave on Sunday, October 20, 2024 within two hours of the end of the NEHC Medal Finals class. All stabling is permanent with doors. Stalls range from 8' x 12' to 9.5' x 12' and have an asphalt base. Stalls must be paid for in advance by September 16, 2024 and are non-refundable if scratch.

FEED & BEDDING: Hay, grain and bedding will be available daily on the grounds through Saturday.

SHARPS, MEDICAL WASTE & STALL MATS: sharps and medical waste must be placed in proper receptacles. Anyone in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by show management. There will be a \$500 fine for any sharps or medical waste found in any stalls. A disposal fee will be charged for stall mats left behind.

ENTRIES: Entries must be received by September 16, 2024. Late entries are accepted with a \$100 post entry fee, with the exception of late qualifiers. Show management reserves the right to further cancel, combine or divide classes when deemed necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show. No refunds will be given. Non-showing horses on grounds must have an entry blank on file.

JUDGING: There will be six judges scoring each round. When the last judge presses the "enter" button, all scores appear on the board. The board instantly gives the "round average," the "cumulative average" indicating all rounds up to that point and a "rank" or placing up to that point.

COLISEUM: Dimensions are 100' x 200'. Footing is well-groomed, all-purpose footing in Coliseum and warm-up areas. Any riders in the main show ring while the ring is officially closed will be automatically eliminated. The Coliseum will be open for warm-ups on Tuesday for schooling over fences, and on Thursday evening for junior showing riders. Junior riders will be allowed one 70-second time slot per rider. Only one horse will be allowed in the ring at a time. Sign up Thursday afternoon in the Presentation area. NEEC reserves the right to have the area of the courtesy circle restricted, which will be marked on the course diagram. Each day's first courses will be posted on the New England Equitation website and Facebook page by 7:00 am each day.

WARM-UP RINGS & LUNGING AREAS: Memorial Avenue lunging area: 360' x 160'. Back lunging ring: 80' x 100'. Indoor schooling ring: 52' x 150'. Outdoor schooling ring: 240' x 150'. Covered ring 100' x 165'. \$30 ring: 125' x 200'. Ring rules will be posted outside of each lunging and schooling ring.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/ or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

CAMPERS: No reservations needed. Pay Eastern States at the gate.

DOGS: Dogs must be on a leash or contained at all times and are the sole responsibility of the owner. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dogs must have proof of rabies vaccine. Loose dogs will be detained and their owners fined \$250.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION: The nearest Hospital is Mercy Medical Center, at 271 Carew Street, Springfield, MA 01104. Approximately 3.5 miles from the horse show grounds.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS: Adhere to USEF and CDC guidelines.

To commemorate his dedication to the NE horse world the NEEC is sponsoring an adult grant of \$1,000. This grant will will be going to a qualified and competing adult NEHC medal rider who demonstrates a financial need in order to participate in the NEHC Championships.

— GUIDELINES —

This grant provides financial assistance to one NEHC adult medal qualifier for: (A) entries and one stall and (B) a stipend to cover horse transportation and other expenses to compete in the NEHC Championships. Riders qualified to compete in the NEHC Championships must apply online at newenglandequitation.com by September 1st. After thorough review, the Adult Grant Committee will award a rider based upon the required essay. Riders must compete in the finals to be eligible. Riders who receive the grant cannot apply in future years, but junior winners may apply as an adult.



the USET Finals. The Skidmore College graduate rode on her intercollegiate team during her junior and senior years. In 1990 she was a member of the National Champion Skidmore team, as well as the Silver Individual Medalist in the Cacchione Cup. Linda (Kossick) Langmeier 1984 JUNIOR MEDAL FINAL 2006 & 2015 ALUMNI CLASS

Linda is one of three NEEC winners to have won the ASPCA Maclay Finals. After her start at Shallowbrook Stables in her hometown of Somers, CT, she teamed up with

trainer Paul Valliere who guided her to big wins during her final junior years and made her a household name in the sport. Along with her national championship win she was also 5th at the AHSA (USEF) Medal Finals and 9th at the USET Medal Finals. She turned professional in 1987 and went to work at Acres Wild Farm. In 1989 she opened her own Kelianda Farm (now in East Granby, CT), which has been wildly successful with strong contenders each year at the finals. ing year on a horse to win. She remains the youngest rider to ever win the NEEC, at age 13. As a student of Fred Hunt & Holly Brewster she was also the youngest ever to win the MHC Junior Finals at age 12, was 4th at the AHSA (USEF) Medal Finals at 13 and is the youngest rider, at 14, ever to win the coveted USET Gold Medal for 20 USET wins. She also had wins in the USEF Medal and ASPCA Maclay at Devon and victories in the High Junior Jumpers at WEF. Kara, a University of Tampa graduate, was the 2002 World Champion A/O Hunter Rider and has earned circuit championships at the HITS winter horse shows as a student of renowned horseman, Don Stewart. Kara and her husband Matt happily reside outside of Tampa with their future Rays players: Matthew, Jr., and his brother, Ryan, as well as their little sister, Amelia Evelyn Baer!



Kate Chope

1986 JUNIOR SPORTSMANSHIP 1986 JUNIOR MEDAL FINAL

An inspiration to all, Kate Chope is one of the best role models in our sport, proving that you can excel in both the classroom and the show ring. She is a Brown University

graduate who later went on to the University of Pennsylvania for veterinary school. Since then he has become the winningest rider in the history of the United States. Adult NEEC (as well as winning the High Point Adult Rider award with an 86.7)! 





KATIE BATTISON HORSEMANSHIP PRACTICUM

Open to all junior exhibitors competing in the New England Horsemen's Council Hunt Seat Medal Final. This award is intended to identify from among our many competitors the all-around horseperson; those who can "do it all." Young horsemen who not only ride well, but understand the great importance of quality horse care.

The top ribbon winners will be determined by adding together scores in the three competition areas; a written test, followed by a "hands on" practicum in the stable area officiated by three judges and the average first round in the New England Finals.

All practicum finalists should dress in appropriate show or groom attire and are required to provide a normal size groom box/bag that they would take to the ring. Helmets are optional.

The written test will be Friday, October 18th from 10:30 am to 3:00 pm. There will be no admittance after 3:00 pm. All test participants will be asked to sign a waiver, agreeing not to disclose any test information to those riders who have not yet taken the exam.

Non-Junior NEHC qualified finalists may take the Horsemanship exam as long as they are entered in the show. They are not eligible to move on to the next phase.

Riders that have previously won this class may continue to enter if they meet the rest of the criteria.

Class 14

USHJA 3'3" HUNTER SEAT MEDAL FINALS

Eligibility Requirements

- A. The USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal is open to Junior Active Members of the USEF and USHJA. Foreign residents who are also members of USEF and USHJA will be eligible to compete. Eligible riders may not compete in any of the following within the same competition year:
 - 1. ASPCA Maclay Finals
 - 2. USEF Hunter Seat Medal Finals
 - 3. USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Finals (East or West)
 - 4. USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic
 - 5. WIHS Equitation Classic Finals
 - 6. Jump Canada Medal Finals
 - 7. North American Equitation Championship
- B. Riders who have competed at 1.30m or higher will not be eligible to compete in the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals.
- C. Riders accumulating a minimum of ten points in any USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal classes between August 2 of the previous competition year and September 1 of the current competition year will be eligible to compete in the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals.
- D. The USHJA, at its discretion, can open up qualifying procedures to allow for additional entries to fill this championship, should insufficient entries be received by the deadline. Additional riders will be invited based on their points earned.
- E. Once a rider has won the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals, she/he is not eligible to compete again in the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal classes or Finals.
- F. Once a rider has competed in any of the aforementioned finals they remain ineligible to compete in the 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal classes or Final.

Course Requirements

- A. To be shown over a course of no less than eight obstacles with fence heights of 3'3" and spreads to 3'6" (exception: triple bar obstacles may have a maximum spread of 4').
- B. For the Finals, all obstacles must be numbered.
- C. One third of the obstacles must be oxers.
- D. Courses must include at least two changes of direction after the first obstacle.
- E. Courses must include at least three of the following:
 - 1. Bending line
 - 2. Narrow jump (5'6"- 8')
 - 3. Roll back turn
 - 4. Fence at the end of the ring
 - 5. Long approach to a single jump
- F. Liverpools, water jumps or water used as decoration are prohibited.

Judging Procedures

- A. To be judged on the seat, hands, guidance and control of the horse.
- B. Two cumulative refusals will result in elimination from the Finals.
- C. If there are 30 or fewer riders competing in Round I, judges must bring back a minimum of the top 15 riders (if available) for Round II. If there are 31 50 riders competing in Round I, judges must bring back a minimum of 20 riders for Round II. If there are more than 51 riders competing in Round I, judges must bring back a minimum of 25 riders for Round II. More riders may be asked to return at the judge's discretion.
- D. Testing: two or more tests of a minimum of the top four competitors are required using USEF tests 1-22. Testing scores will not be announced.
- E. Only one rider per horse may compete in the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Final.

Tack

A. Refer to EQ106.5a in the USEF Rulebook.

Awards

A. For the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals, ribbons will be awarded first through twelfth place for overall placings. The presentation of awards is to be given in reverse order.

Schooling Requirements for the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals

- A. Horses are required to be stabled on the competition grounds a minimum of twelve hours before the start of the competition.
- B. Trainers/Coaches are permitted to ride and school competitors horses.
- C. Trainers/Coaches are permitted to walk Rounds I and II with the competitors.

Judging Requirements for the USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals

The USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal Finals will be judged by a panel of two judges with "R" Registered status in the Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation Division. One of the "R" registered judges must be approved by the USHJA Equitation Task Force prior to the final.

Class 15

CHALLENGE OF THE STATES INVITATIONAL

Philanthropy is an important part of the mission of the New England Equitation Championships. Thus, the Challenge of the States winners will work together to choose an organization that they feel will benefit from a donation, made possible by an anonymous donor. This component was developed to encourage our young riders to learn the importance of giving back. The Medal winning teams will each donate a minimum of \$1,500 (Gold Team \$750, Silver Team \$500 and Bronze Team \$250) to the top three charities that will be chosen by the riders before the start of the class. There will be additional opportunities to donate to these charities during the horse show.

Open to junior riders, who will represent the state they reside in, with the top six scores from the open equitation classes. The top four riders with the highest scores will ride and the riders with the fifth and sixth highest scores will be the chef d'equips. Riding members must have a minimum score of 50, chef d'equips can have any score, to make up a team. The top three scores will count for the team total. Number of teams for each state will be determined as follows, with management reserving the right to change:

- 3 25 riders will be one team
- 26 50 riders will be two teams
- 51 75 riders will be three teams
- 76 and more riders will be four teams

An additional team of the next six highest scores of juniors in their last year will be added, score must be a minimum of 50 for riders, chefs can have any score.



If a junior in their last year is a Chef d'equip but has a score high enough to ride on the Graduate Team, that junior will be moved to the Graduate Team as a rider. The rider with the next highest score will move up to be the Chef d'equip on the team that just lost one of its Chefs.

States with fewer than four riders will be combined, as the All American team where the top six scores from these states will become the team. If there are not four of these riders they may then compete as individuals.

Teams work together, without the help of trainers. Only the two Chefs will be allowed in the schooling area to help its rider school. Once a horse has gone it can go back to the barn, there is no further testing.

There will be eight to ten jumps, not to exceed 3'0". Two tests (USEF 1-20) will be built into the course. The Steward will supervise the schooling area. Jumps cannot be higher than 3' and they will be flagged. Trainers are not allowed in schooling area.

Costume Rules

Teams may dress up their riders and horses in costume. Costumes must be safe in manner. Costumes may not obstruct the vision of either horse or rider and must not impede movement on course. No objects may be placed in horse's tail or on or around horse's face that could potentially spook or distract the horse. Competition management will be the deciding factor should a team's costume be in question. Horses must be unbraided.

Riders must be competing in the NEHC finals or be a past NEHC finals winner in order to be eligible for this class. Each rider's USEF address will determine the state that they will represent.







New England Horsemen's Council encourages junior and adult riders to pursue education beyond the high school level and awards a \$500 educational scholarship in the following disciplines: Hunter Seat Equitation, Hunter Seat Pleasure Equitation, Saddle Seat Equitation, and Western/Reining Seat. Candidates for the Hunter Seat Equitation scholarship must be a NEHC member in good standing and have qualified for the Medal in the year of the final. Candidates must also be attending school as a high school senior or full-time college student. Selection will be based on the ability and aptitude for pursuing education beyond the high school level, community service, leadership and achievement with horses; less on financial need.

Previous applicants who were not awarded the scholarship may reapply.

— GUIDELINES —

The application can be completed at newenglandequitation.com. The deadline for the receipt of applications is October 1st. If in the opinion of the Scholarship Committee no applicant meets the standards as set by the Committee, the scholarship funds will be held within the NEHC scholarship account. NEHC furnishes the NEEC medal committee with a certificate to be awarded to the scholarship winner. Scholarship winners must present their transcript with a minimum 3.0 grade point average after a semester in post-secondary school to the administration office to receive the payment. The scholarship will expire in five years unless a letter of intent is received by the NEHC office.



Originally purchased for Hillary as an equitation horse for her last junior year in the late 1980s, Nicholas went from a dressage/eventing backround to a consistent show horse in less than a year. Hillary and Nicholas had top ribbons at many of the major horse shows including Devon (PA) and Harrisburg (PA). Hillary's last junior year included the New England Medal Finals, the AHSA Medal Finals (Harrisburg) and the ASPCA Maclay Finals at Madison Square Garden (NY). After colic surgery the following spring, Nicholas resumed his successful showing career in the Adult ranks with older sister Elizabeth. The pair had many wins in the equitation including Reserve Champion at the first New England Adult Amateur Finals, Reserve Champion at the Rhode Island Equitation Championships and Bronze at the Connecticut Hunter Jumper Association Championships. Following a second colic surgery the next year, Nicholas was leased to Kristen Bumpus for the conclusion of her last junior year. The pair went on to become the "most winning" rider-equine combination at the New England Finals. By the end of the weekend the duo had won the open equitation 15-17, the New England Final, the MHC Finals and the Zone 1 Final. Continuing their winning ways, they went on to receive Reserve Champion at the AHSA Finals and had top ribbons at the USET Talent Search (Gladstone, NJ) as well as the ASPCA Maclay Finals at the Meadowlands (NJ). The next showing season Nicholas returned to the show ring as a hunter at the age of 18 and competed in the Amateur-Owner division with Elizabeth. The two competed at Devon and Washington International Horse Show (MD) and finished with year end championships from the New England Horsemen's Council, Rhode Island Horseman's Association, Massachusetts Horsemen's Council and Connecticut Hunter Jumper Association. The Nicholas Award, as it is commonly known, was first presented in 1998 as an acknowledgement for the horse who is the most versatile within the sport.

The winner will be awarded \$750 from the NEEC and \$750 from the NHS to be put towards stall, entries and entry blank fees at each final.


Mason Phelps (1948-2021) was involved in our sport in every way possible: from groom to Olympian to governing leader and more. He launched dozens of ingenious events that raised money and interest in Equestrian sports over his career including the AA rated Christmas show in San Antonio, the American Jumping Derby (later the International Jumping Derby), the New England Hunt Seat Medal (in 1977), and numerous inventive classes in the early days of WEF. Phelps served and left his mark on numerous boards and committees including the AHSA (now USEF), USET, Show Jumping Hall of Fame, NEHC, RIHA, The National Horse Show, and as a show judge and trainer. Phelps was an integral part of the creation of the Equestrian Aid Foundation and served at the Athletes Equity Resource Center. His "Denim and Diamonds" gala was the event of the season for many years at WEF and raised millions for the sport. Friends joked he could exceed an unlimited budget! He also gave a lot of his own money to equestrian causes without a lot of recognition.

In his early days at the Aquidneck Island Pony Club, every Saturday Phelps taught numerous children how to ride, muck, and groom for free. Phelps loved people who loved our sport, and it is said he propped up and pushed forward many of his fellow horsemen. In 2001, after retiring from riding and teaching, Phelps launched Phelps Media Group which despite his lack of experience in PR became "America's most progressive and successful Equestrian PR firm."

A longtime president of the NHS, Phelps was instrumental in The National Horse Show finding its "forever home" at the Kentucky Horse Park and served on the board until recently. He created the New England Hunt Seat Medal class as a stepping-stone for riders to make it through Regionals and on to the National Horse Show. It was important to him that financials should not prevent a qualified rider from attending a national final.



Non-Junior NEHC qualified finalists may take the Horsemanship exam as long as they are entered in the show. They are not eligible to move on to the next phase.

Riders that have previously won this class may continue to enter if they meet the rest of the criteria.



Endeavor Therapeutic Horsemanship

Endeavor provides a breadth of highly customized direct service programs that support the development of physical, cognitive, emotional and social skills of participants with a wide range of diagnoses, disabilities and challenging histories including: addiction, autism spectrum disorders, multiple sclerosis, traumatic brain injury, cancer, stroke, cerebral palsy, global development delay, down syndrome, epilepsy, abuse, sexual trafficking and exploitation, Lyme disease, visual impairment, hearing impairment, and PTSD, among others.

The organization is guided by a philosophy of inclusion that is reflected in the way in which horses are incorporated into treatment interventions as valuable partners, and able-bodied siblings are encouraged to participate in all activities side-by-side with their participating brothers and sisters. Participants at Endeavor are not limited by perceptions or boundaries and are encouraged and supported to set and meet stretch goals that are often far beyond even their own expectations.



Residential Youth Horsemanship

Endeavor partners with local residential facilities to support the efforts for positive youth development to the area's most vulnerable young men and women due a variety of factors including disability, poverty, racism, mental health diagnosis, and histories of trauma.

Equine Assisted Learning

Endeavor partners with local schools and school districts to offer programs in the sensory rich environment of our farm. Endeavor instructors partner with the teachers to create lesson plans that complement the learning objectives in the classroom.

Therapeutic Horsemanship

Veteran and Active Duty Military


